Pastor's Desk

May the Spirit of our Risen Lord give you peace.

Alleluia!!!

The Synoptic Gospel of Mark's account of Jesus' Resurrection is clear, brief and says enough.

The three women who went to the tomb that Sunday morning had lost their faith—they intended to anoint the corpse of the crucified Christ. Love was there, but not faith. The last thing they expected was an empty tomb.

All the other disciples had lost faith, too. We might remember the young man mentioned in last Sunday's Gospel, the one in Gethsemane after Jesus was arrested and carried off. He was wearing a linen cloth, but when grabbed by one of the guards, left it with him and fled naked. He was Mark's poetic way of symbolizing all the disciples. From the point of view of faith, they were left totally naked when Jesus was led away under guard.

On Sunday morning, the three women came to the tomb. It was opened, so they went in. Jesus's body was not there, there was a young man in a white robe seated on the right-hand side. Mark was back to his poetry. This time, the young man was a symbol of every post-resurrection Christian disciple, with the white robe indicating faith, and the right-hand side simply a state of dignity and intimacy. He knew the mystery: *JESUS IS RISEN*! and he would tell whoever would listen.

Jesus's resurrection took place on the first day of the week, just as the sun was rising—the beginning of a new week, indeed, of a new creation. The sun is still rising.

The task of the young man was to declare that **CHRIST IS RISEN**. What does that mean? We take it so much for granted that we have possibly thought very little about it. At the very least, it means that he is no longer confined by time and space. He can be in us, and we in him—again, whatever that means. But if we reflect, I think that most, if not all, of us can assent to that.

The young man in white told the women to tell the disciples, *He is going before you to Galilee; It is there you will find him*. Galilee was the place where the disciples were at home. Our Galilee is wherever we are in the church and at home. We find Christ in life when we seriously commit ourselves to attending Mass and engaging in engaging with our Parish.

If we want the world believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ we must deepen our love for Jesus. We must learn more about him daily. We want to do our very best, through God's grace, to imitate him. In truth, God himself invites us into his life and we must respond to inviting God into ours.

I invite all of you to come and join us in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00 pm on the Second Sunday of Easter / Divine Mercy Sunday, April 7th. According to the Church, on this Sunday of Divine Mercy, a plenary indulgence is granted to those who participate in this devotion and meet the necessary requirements. We pray for the conversion of the hearts of the whole world.

I would like to express my heartfelt thanks and appreciation to all of you for your contributions that help us to meet the needs of the parish. Please keep in mind that without your generous hearts and your charitable actions, we cannot keep the church open to gather together to worship God and we cannot undertake other charitable works for the poor.

I pray for all of you before God that you and your family will have abundant blessings during this Easter season with the whole universal Church in celebrating the Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ, our Savior, and our Redeemer. Have a blessed Holy Easter. Christ is Risen, Alleluia!

Truly, He is Risen, Alleluia!!!




